

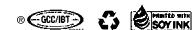

WHY CHOICE MATTERS IN 2010

Every state office, from Governor to State Controller, has an impact upon reproductive rights, whether it's speaking out from the bully pulpit, exerting influence on the budget, determining school curricula, or drafting descriptions of propositions. Please share this voter guide and the details below, so that everyone can be informed about how reproductive rights will be impacted by their vote!



GOVERNOR

California needs a governor who considers the consequences for family planning and choice in every decision. In 2010, the governor proposed cutting family services and vetoed a bill that would have ensured that health-insurance companies provide maternity care for women. **Jerry Brown** has a strong record of protecting and supporting pro-choice policies, while Meg Whitman refuses to take a stand on the issue. We can't afford to elect a governor who refuses to let voters know where she stands on choice, which is why we must elect Jerry Brown in November.



LT. GOVERNOR

It is so important to ensure that our top leaders in Sacramento can all be counted upon to fight for a woman's right to choose. If the governor is impeached, absent from the state, or under temporary disability the Lieutenant Governor has the authority to act in his/her absence. Earlier this year, Californians worried that acting-Lt. Governor Abel Maldonado would file an appeal to the Proposition 8 decision while the governor was away. We must ensure that the next Lt. Governor is someone who supports civil rights and will act in the best interest of all Californians. **Gavin Newsom's** commitment to pro-privacy, pro-choice policies is confirmation that he will continue to support our issues if elected to the office of Lt. Governor.



ATTORNEY GENERAL

In 2004, Congress passed a law requiring states to exempt health-care corporations from any law or policy that ensures women access to abortion services or referrals. California was the only state to challenge the law. Thankfully, it was contested by then-Attorney General Bill Lockyer, who stepped up to challenge the fact that it undermined California's protections of women's rights. Our Attorney General plays a key role in enforcing the laws that protect choice, and is responsible for bringing lawsuits against those who seek to undermine these rights. Send **Kamala Harris** to Sacramento to continue California's tradition of standing up for choice!



INSURANCE COMMISSIONER

The Insurance Commissioner is responsible for how the insurance industry conducts business in California and will be responsible for reconciling California's current progressive public health laws with the new federal health-care reform, which restricts coverage for family planning services. **Dave Jones** has proudly supported reproductive rights throughout his career and is sure to keep choice in mind when implementing these new laws. Vote for Dave Jones on November 2!

VOTE NOVEMBER 2ND

Pollsters and pundits are expecting a low voter turnout for this year's midterm election, and choice has arisen as a hot-button issue in races across the country, including right here in California.
